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1. Background

The Child Friendly Local Governance (CFLG) program is one of program passed by Maijogmai Rural Municipality under annual approved budget for FY 2075.76. This program has been approved and programs based on the provision of Article 66 of the Local Government Operation Act 2074. The main goal of this program is to declare Maijogmai Rural Municipality as a Child Friendly. This program was implemented after the contract between rural municipality and Namsaling Community Development Center (NCDC), on 2076.1.3. This report has been prepared after the implementation of activities as described in the contract with funding partnership between two parties on which Rural Municipality has contributed 70% and NCDC has contributed 30% of total cost.

2. Goals and Objectives

The goals and objectives have been set out as follows to declare this Maijogmai Rural Municipality as a child friendly.

2.1 Goals

To arrangement basis for the declaration of child friendly rural municipality

2.2 Objectives

- Local working organizations will provide information about the work done in the sector of child and will promote to accomplish remaining work
- Formation & Capacity build-up of child protection committees and networks
- To create child friendly structures

3 Accomplished Activities

3.1 Coordination meeting at Rural Municipality Level

In the first phase, a one-day coordination meeting at the rural municipality level has been held to discuss the program outline, budget, human resource mobilization, deadline etc.

3.2 Ward level data collection of child (Ward office, Health institutions, Schools)

Prior to implementation of the program, data was collected with the purpose of gathering information of the present status at rural municipality. The activities were conducted with the aim of making the activities under this program more effective and collecting suggestions.

3.3 Awareness program against child marriage and Menstrual Hygiene Management at Schools

The following awareness programs have been completed in schools for child marriage and menstrual hygiene management:

3.3.1 Street Drama Performance

Street drama is also one of the many means of effective learning. The street drama was performed in a lead schools of all 6 wards to achieve the goal of child marriage free and menstrual hygiene comprehending society envisaged by this program. The main themes of the play were child marriage, menstrual hygiene, safe drinking water, use of toilets etc. The street play conducted date, location and number of beneficiaries are presented in table as follows:

Children have a natural right to have safe drinking water. The program also aimed to provide safe drinking water to children. Filters are distributed to manage safe drinking water by analyzing the needs and number of students for this task. 3.5 Sanitary Pad Management at School

In the context of Nepal, the issue of menstrual hygiene management is not given much priority in schools. As a result, teenagers do not go to school due to lack of sanitary materials (water, soap, toilets, and sanitary pads). In view of this 528 packets sanitary pads have been distributed to 10 schools to start the management of sanitary pads in schools. The dates of operation, School Name, distributed number of pad and number of beneficiaries are presented in table below:

3.8 Wall Magazine Publications in Community Schools

Capacity development training was organized for the representative of child club and networks for the purpose of developing all round capacity of children under the CFLG program. In the same program, the students were provided with knowledge and information about publishing wall magazine with the goal of uncovering their hidden potential. Against this backdrop, Nrs 2,000 was provided to the 10 community schools of the rural municipality, so that they could apply what they have learned in the program. 3.10 Capacity Development of ward level Child Club & Networks

Under the CFLG program 2 days capacity development program was organized for the representatives of the child club & network for the purpose of their all-round development. Coordination of the ward office consisted of representatives of the restructured child club and child network. The training included information about the concept of CFLG, it's indicators, drinking water, hygiene and sanitation, menstrual hygiene management, child rights, method of formation of child club, writing meeting minutes, conducting meeting, publishing wall magazines. This event was organized in all wards of Rural Municipality. The program conducted date, location and number of participants of the program are presented in the table below:

3.12 Analysis of CFLG indicators

The data's related to child work that different organization have conducted in all wards were collected and analyzed under CFLG adopt rural municipality declaration preparedness program. As per the contract with rural municipality the activities were conducted, baseline data were collected and after the completion of program the discussion and interaction with related stakeholders was organized. Hence, the difference between before and after program was analyzed.

3.13 Review of CFLG program at Rural Municipality Level

The program was reviewed the presence concerned stakeholders after the completion of all the activities as per the agreement between Maijogmai Rural Municipality and Namsaling Community Development Center. In which progress was presented on behalf of the organization the program was attended by 30 member's (rural municipality president, ward chairmen, executive members, chief executive, and other concerned organization). In that presentation suggestions were received from the stakeholders. Based on the suggestions received the final progress report of the program has been prepared and presented to the rural municipality.

4 Achievements of the program

Following achievements have been obtained from various activities completed under the pre-preparation program for the declaration of CFLG at Maijogmai Rural Municipality:

- Community people of all six wards were aware about the CFLG program was easy to fulfill the indicators.
- 1280 students (540 boys, 740 girls) were aware of child marriage, menstrual hygiene safe drinking water, use of toilets, from the drama presented at 6 places.
- 557 students (232 boys, 325 girls) received information about Child marriage, menstrual hygiene, and child violence from the interaction program organized at 9 schools.
- 1595 students from 26 schools have benefited from the safe drinking water system (Filter) distributed for the management of safe drinking water.
- Under the menstrual hygiene management, 685 girls' students have directly benefited from the sanitary pads provided at various 10 schools.
- The flex of school level code of conduct, created 286 (121 Male, 165 Female) stakeholders has been made available to all 43 schools of rural municipality which will directly benefit 3539 students.
- The flex of ward level code of conduct, created 205 (107 Male, 98 Female) stakeholders has been made available to all wards of rural municipality which will directly benefit all the public of rural municipality.
- The funds provided to 10 schools for publication of wall magazine directly benefited 1825 students.
- 340 students will be benefited from 136 piece Heat mats (2 meter each) provided to 34 child development centers of all 6 wards.
- 196 (101 boys, 95 girls) representatives of child club and child network got information about CFLG, it's indicators, drinking water sanitation and hygiene, Menstrual hygiene management, wall magazine publication, held in all the wards.
- 177 (32 Male, 145 Female) representatives of child club and child network got information about CFLG, it's indicators, drinking water sanitation and hygiene,

Menstrual hygiene management, role of local government in CFLG, held in all the wards.

5 Challenges

Following are the problems encountered while conducting various activities to complete the program:

- Difficulty with completing the program due to the time delay of the program agreement
- Due to the fact that there is only a school based child club and the child club cannot be formed in the basic school (grades 1-5), it is difficult to accommodate all children.

6 Efforts for Solution

The following measures to taken to solve the problems encountered while completing the program:

- Efforts are made to make the program successful by mobilizing maximum human resources.
- Child clubs are formed only in the schools were it could be formed

7 Learning

- It is equally important to have the right timely agreement in order for the program to run on time and to operate effectively.

8 Conclusion

Analysis of the achievements and activities of all the 6 wards of Maijogmai Rural Municipality are as follows:

- Out of 10 indicators of Child survival at least 10% of indicator 4, 5% of indicator 5, 30% of indicator 9, 10% of indicator 10 are yet to be completed.
- Out of 5 major indicators of Child Protection at least 50% of indicator 4, 5% of indicator 5 are yet to be achieved.
- Out of 6 major indicators of Child Development at least 10% of indicator is yet to be achieved.
- Out of 6 major indicators of Child Participation at least 20% of indicator 1, 10% of indicator 2, 10% of indicator 5, 100% of indicator 6 are yet to be achieved.
- Out of the major 12 indicators of institutional development, 50% of indicator 2, 10% of indicator 6, 10% of indicator 7, 50% of indicator 8, 20% of indicator 9, 20% of indicator 10, indicator 11 is yet to be analyzed, 100% of indicator 12 are yet to be achieved.
